- Session received the Deacon's minutes from their meeting on September 22, 2024.
- Session received the YTD Financial report prepared by Carolyn McMillan:
   YTD Expenses are \$218,710.54. YTD Income total is \$168,340.50. The YTD deficit is \$50,370.04.
   The money from the Broad Street project sale was received from the City of Fairborn.

- The Clerk advised the session that recent Book of Order changes require us to have additional written policies/practices. Julie, Kathleen, and Joe will work on these changes.
- All women are invited to attend a Women's Spiritual Nurture Retreat at Kirkmont camp from April 25-27, 2025.




### **Christmas Card Crusade**
